## **THE HOLY TRINITY AND YOU**

Does anyone remember *The DaVinci Code*? The reviewer in *The New Yorker Magazine* said the Catholic Church had nothing to be worried about; the film version was awful, but I was more bothered because a good fellow I knew, who couldn't resist reading the book, actually thought some of it might be true.

Nevertheless, at the time, I found the controversy a good opportunity to reflect on what, according to *The Catechism of the Catholic Church*, was the "central mystery of Christian faith and life": the Holy Trinity. We profess it at that key juncture in our Sunday Mass between the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist with the Nicene Creed. Dan Brown, in *The DaVinci Code*, believes that the Holy Trinity was an invention of the Church - and more exactly, the Roman Emperor Constantine - at the Council of Nicea in 325 AD. Have we been hoodwinked? Does he know something we don't?

No. A survey of history and the written "relations" of the gathering provide ample evidence that the Council, rather than ratifying some notion dreamed up by the first Christian emperor (to what end, who could say?) was actually convened to defend an idea that most Christians took for granted: that God was Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

At the time, a priest named Arius figured it was impossible to conceive of a divine person suffering in the manner Jesus did. He concluded therefore that Jesus was just human and later elevated to divine status (but not quite the Son of God) through an act of adoption by the Father. Thus, Arianism, a departure from the traditional understanding of the Trinity, took the world by storm perhaps because it was similar to a Greek myth, for some a more comfortable story. Yet, not only did this contradict the evidence of Jesus's sayings in scripture about his relationship with the Father and the Holy Spirit, it made his words referring to his Father as "our Father" and inviting us to call God "abba" or "daddy" merely symbolic or even empty. By this reasoning, the human person could never aspire to share in the divine life of God in Eternity!

Of course, the human heart could never be satisfied with such a mediocre notion. The *sensus fidelii* (the sense of the faithful), rooted in scripture and the constant teaching of the Church, really did believe that what Jesus said - that he was the Son of His Father in Heaven, and that the Holy Spirit proceeded in communion from the Father and the Son - he really meant. By his assumption of a human

nature, the Son (who is Jesus) grants us a share in his divinity and life with his Father and the Holy Spirit. (This is why you - everyone for that matter - count so much!)

It's not a notion that can be simply grasped. St. Patrick evidently used a shamrock to describe how it might be possible, but honestly, there is nothing in reality which exists in such complete union with something else that it is not only the same as that something else but *is* that something else, while remaining distinctly what it is in itself. The only kind of communion that comes close occurs when we enter in that Holy Communion through the Eucharist!

Yes, what I have written, I have written! That God is a Holy Trinity was taught by Jesus and handed on to the Faithful by the Apostles, whose successors (the bishops) have ever been trying to define with greater precision what we believe because the teaching lends itself to misunderstanding and often, heresy. Thank God for the Holy Spirit, who enabled the bishops at the Council of Nicea to put it about as well as it could be. Three Persons, Father, Son & Holy Spirit, in one God, is what we say we believe when we say together, "I believe in one God...." It's not an idea that is impossible to probe, but it takes an appreciation for the sublime (something Arius and Dan Brown seemed to have lacked), and above all, a closeness to God through the Sacraments and prayer.

For us, called to be a sign of Christ through our communion in Him and with and for one another, the Most Holy Trinity, Three Persons in One God, conveys that perfect unity which is the reality of Love. This central mystery of our faith invites us to experience that Oneness in our life together, through friendship, family, and *parish*. Jesus's instruction to be perfect as your Heavenly Father is perfect is our call to imitate that perfect love of the Holy Trinity that is the very Love which we share in and which makes our love possible.
