From Father Doughty

This Sunday we welcome to the parish Father William Kyere, a priest from the Diocese of Sunyani in Ghana (Fr. Simon's diocese). Father William will be helping us through the summer while our clergy take some vacation. He has served in the Archdiocese before, working as a parochial vicar at St. Joseph Parish in Millbrook, New York. Father William is the pastor of the Christ the King Cathedral in Sunyani.

Sadly this weekend we say goodbye to Dan Walker and his wife Cathy, and Billy and Grace, their children. Dan has been providing the music for our 11:00 am Mass at St. Thomas on Sundays. He began his service to our parish when he and Cathy pitched in at St. Thomas School, helping to organize music for school Masses, Father/Daughter dances, the school play and Christmas and Spring concerts. Just recently he directed the music at our Christmas pageant and Christmas Eve Mass. He also rehearsed and directed our second graders for their First Holy Communion. Dan did it all **as a volunteer!** Today's 11:00 am will be his last Mass in the parish, though we hope Dan and Cathy and the kids will not be strangers to us and will always feel welcome and appreciated. A reception will follow the Mass in the school gym.

Father Bob Phelps, who provides help for us by celebrating Sunday Masses, has published a new book of his poetry, **Incessancy, Stories of God**. Twenty-eight poems, including a vision of atheist apologist Christopher Hitchens sipping a dry martini in heaven, a gentle 99 year old Irishman waiting for God, the Coptic martyrs on a Libyan beach, and a Daily News photo of an observant Jew on the A Train, all point to the mystery of God among us. **Incessancy** is available for \$9.99 in e-book format from any e-book store.
