ALLELUIA

EASTER JOY

It is the first and most important feast day of the Church, and that should make sense. One Sunday morning, round about two thousand years ago in Jerusalem, a man rose from the dead, something that no one had ever heard of before. It was not a ruse; all who knew him and all in the city knew the quality and certainty of his death. Yet, now he was alive – and different though the same. Different, because death was no longer written into his humanity. The same, because there was no mistaking that it was really him: the marks of his passion were still there on his risen body. I can hardly figure out how this day, above all days, is not grasped by the entire world and its history as singular and indispensable.

The joy that we should experience on Easter Sunday (and every Sunday of the year which celebrates that extraordinary event) should be total. It should suffuse every element of our being, heart, mind, body and soul. Because simply, there is no greater, better, more important news which can have an impact on our life than that someone has risen from the dead. Some may figure this out with the help of wisdom: the possibility of never-ending life should seem reasonably to be a prospect that cannot be overlooked. For most, however, the event of the Resurrection moves us because we know what it is to live in the valley of the shadow of death, mourning and weeping in this vale of tears. Some years ago, I was teaching the second graders about Jesus' Body and Blood in the Holy Communion they were about to receive and why we call it the Bread of Life. I mentioned how, even now, the Eucharist brought them not only into the presence of their Father in Heaven but also united them with the communion of the saints, including their grandparents who had died, and uncles and aunts and neighbors, and in a few cases, with their mommies or daddies who had passed away. One child who was very quiet throughout came over to me when I was finished and grasping me around the knees, gave me a big hug in the only way he knew to show how grateful he was to have learned this important news.

I pray that this year, our Easter celebration of the good news of the Resurrection touches you in an extraordinary way and brings you total joy. On behalf of the clergy of St. Thomas of Canterbury-St. Joseph Parish, Father Simon, Father Bob, Deacon John, Deacon Len, Deacon Tony and Deacon Joe, I extend

our wishes and blessings, and promise you our prayers for a happy Easter.


