A NEW NAME:

WHAT WE'RE SENDING THE CARDINAL

*"Glory be to God whose infinite power working in us can accomplish more than we can ask or imagine!"
Ephesians 3:20-21*

At long last, your parish implementation team has selected three names to send to Cardinal Dolan to help him choose a new name for our recently merged parish that is comprised of the former parish communities of St. Thomas of Canterbury and St. Joseph. His Eminence's choice will determine to whom we might look as a principal patron for heavenly intercession, guidance, and a continued strengthening in our union with Christ.

Each member of the team took into careful consideration all of the little over one hundred recommendations submitted by parishioners. There was no clear consensus about any particular suggestion. A number of respondents suggested retaining the hyphenated name "St. Thomas of Canterbury – St. Joseph Parish," yet all on the team agreed - since each church will continue to be known by the name in which they were consecrated – that a new name or identity would help everyone to better grasp the reality of the merger and importantly, envision new possibilities for making the parish a more vibrant community in Christ. Thus, whatever the results of our deliberations, it was acknowledged that the parish would be known as the "Parish of _____, with the Churches of St. Thomas of Canterbury and St. Joseph."

We followed a common practice in business to help us come to an agreement among ourselves. Every member was asked to take the list of suggestions home to ponder them, pray about them, and decide which of three names they would like to present at our next gathering. Each would be allotted ten minutes to give reasons why any especial name should be accepted. We gathered in the church and prayed that the same grace of the Holy Spirit that fell upon the disciples at the first Pentecost would assist us too. After all had spoken, we quietly and prayerfully voted in favor of our individual choices. These were tallied and recorded immediately afterward in everyone's presence.

From your suggestions and, we pray, through the intercession of St. Joseph and St. Thomas of Canterbury, the team has chosen to suggest the following names to His Eminence in order of preference:

1. Holy Family

2. Divine Mercy
3. St. Marianne Cope

These are only suggestions, however. As was mentioned earlier in these pages, Cardinal Dolan could decide to choose an altogether different name. We trust that the Spirit will guide his decision for the good of the parish and her people.

We are grateful for your participation and prayers in this arduous process, and ask that you continue to pray that our parish may become what the Lord intended it to be.
