DEACON'S CORNER

ARE YOU A MARTHA OR A MARY

Probably many of you, like me, have reflected on whether we are more like Martha or more like Mary as we have traveled our life's path and faith journey. Probably many of you, like me, are clearly in the "A-type" personality category and can very easily identify with Martha. Those of us with this personality trait are concerned about getting things done and getting them done correctly and getting them done in a timely manner. Sometimes we have little tolerance for inefficiency or dallying on the part of others to the extent that our reactions toward others might come very close to or even be considered sinful if we are not careful. It clearly isn't our intent, but our reactions to others who don't follow the same road as we do can easily be negative and hurtful. This can cause concern, because, again if you are like me, we want to see everyone happy and we want to be helpful and giving and supportive and all those positive Christian traits that are the foundation of our faith.

So, maybe in reflection we should consider taking more opportunities to be more like Mary. We should try to not get bogged down in procedure and process and wanting everything to be right and in order. We may need occasionally to "stop and smell the roses". To put it in perspective, if we knew that Jesus was coming to visit our parish would we be more concerned about how neat and clean each church was; whether there were beautiful flowers adorning the altar; whether we made the effort to meet with the music ministry and assure that we had the most beautiful and prayerful music for the visit; or would we rather run to the door of the church and wait for the visit with great anticipation and then hang on every word that Jesus spoke to us and focus entirely on his presence and the peace and love that he would bring by the very fact of him being in our midst.

I don't think anyone needs to change who they are, but it may be in our best interest to have a good balance in our lives between the doing and reflecting.

Although most of my life seems to be focused on the "doing" I always look forward to my annual retreat when I spend a weekend at a Trappist monastery where the atmosphere is quiet and reflective with very little conversation with fellow retreatants. We join the monks in the back of the chapel for each of the daily prayer hours and Mass, and except for a short presentation on Saturday and Sunday morning by one of the monks, and the prayer hours and Masses, the rest of the time is spent in our rooms reading and praying. I always come back home feeling refreshed and recharged. Of course then I usually resume my life of being a Martha for most of the rest of the year. I guess maybe I need to work on maintaining that balance on a continuing basis! Maybe some of you will join me in that endeavor. God bless you all.

Next weekend we welcome Land of Peace, a non-profit 501(c)(3) organization which dedicates itself to helping the people of the Holy Land by, among other ways, selling their olive-wood crafts at churches throughout the United States.



Being for the most part isolated by on their small piece of land that has been known historically as Palestine and more lately as the West Bank, Palestinian Christians suffer grave poverty and lack of opportunity. Caught between war and intractable politics, they struggle not only to make ends meet, but also to find some reasonable hope of a good life for their children. Land of Peace is raising funds to build a charity hospital in Bethlehem where the Savior was born and provide medical services throughout the Holy Land. It supports families with members who have special needs. It gives help to students who cannot afford to begin or complete higher education at some of the colleges and universities in the Holy Land, and seeks to provide vocational skills and educational opportunities for our young Christian brothers and sisters. Lastly, they wish to help fulfill the request of our Popes from Paul VI to Francis I, which is to help Christian families remain their homes, in the place of Christianity's origins.

The olive wood trade is an ancient tradition which expresses the profound faith of the people who walk where Jesus walked. Please stop by next week, see their work, and consider helping them by buying their wares, and maybe get some of your Christmas shopping done early this year!
