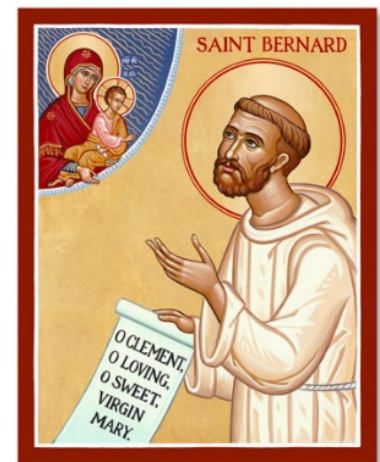

SAINT BERNARD of CLAIRVAUX

Bernard was born near Dijon, France. He entered the Cistercians and at the age of 24 he was sent to found Clairvaux, where he fathered many reforms. Bernard heeded the requests of popes and bishops to arbitrate disputes and rouse the faithful in Europe. He liked to call himself *Beatae Mariae capellanus*, "Mary's faithful chaplain." Bernard was one of the Church's great thaumaturges or wonder workers. Thousands would line the roads he traveled, waiting for his healing touch. He himself suffered from lifelong stomach trouble. Bernard died in 1153. "What we love," he taught, "we shall grow to resemble."

THERE'S SOMETHING ABOUT MARY

*In inaugurating a Year of Faith, Pope Benedict XVI has asked the Faithful to consider reflect studiously and prayerfully on the gift of the Second Vatican Council which was convened fifty years ago. **Lumen Gentium** (the "Light of the Nations") with **Gaudium et Spes**, was one of the principal documents of the council, a work that repropose the mystery of the Church. The Council Fathers devoted the very last chapter to Our Lady and her relationship to the Mystical Body of Christ. A passage from that chapter, on the role of Mary in God's plan of salvation, is provided below for reflection for tomorrow's solemn feast of the Assumption of Mary. Though not Holy Day of Obligation (because it falls on Monday this year), it is still a feast that every Catholic, every Christian should mark by prayer and if possible, attendance at Mass. (Note: There will be an extra Mass on Monday at Noon, along with the 8:30 am and the 6:30 pm at St. Joseph.)*

The Sacred Scriptures of both the Old and the New Testament, as well as ancient Tradition show the role of the Mother of the Savior in salvation in an ever clearer light and draw attention to it. The books of the Old Testament describe the history of salvation, by which the coming of Christ into the world was slowly prepared. These earliest documents, as they are read in the Church and are understood in the light of a further and full revelation, bring the figure of the woman, Mother of the Redeemer, into a gradually clearer light. When it is looked at in this way, she is already prophetically foreshadowed in the promise of victory over the serpent which was given to our first parents after their fall into sin

(Gen 3:15) Likewise she is the Virgin who shall conceive and bear a son, whose name will be called Emmanuel. (Isa 7:14, Mt 1:22) She stands out among the poor and humble of the Lord, who confidently hope for and receive salvation from Him. With her the exalted Daughter of Sion, and after a long expectation of the promise, the times are fulfilled... when the Son of God took a human nature from her, that He might in the mysteries of His flesh free man from sin.

The Father of mercies willed that the incarnation should be preceded by the acceptance of her who was predestined to be the mother of His Son, so that just as a woman contributed to death, so also a woman should contribute to life. That is true in outstanding fashion of the mother of Jesus, who gave to the world Him who is Life itself and who renews all things, and who was enriched by God with gifts which befit such a role. It is no wonder therefore that the

usage prevailed among the Fathers whereby they called the mother of God entirely holy and free from all stain of sin, as though fashioned by the Holy Spirit and formed as a new creature. Adorned from the first instant of her conception with the radiance of an entirely unique holiness, the Virgin of Nazareth is greeted, on God's command, by an angel messenger as "full of grace", (Lk 1:28) and to the heavenly messenger she replies: "Behold the handmaid of the Lord, be it done unto me according to thy word". (Lk 1:38) Thus Mary, a daughter of Adam, consenting to the divine Word, became the mother of Jesus, the one and only Mediator. Embracing God's salvific will with a full heart and impeded by no sin, she devoted herself totally as a handmaid of the Lord to the person and work of her Son, under Him and with Him, by the grace of almighty God, serving the mystery of redemption. Rightly therefore the holy Fathers see her as used by God not merely in a passive way, but as freely cooperating in the work of human salvation through faith and obedience. For, as St. Irenaeus says, she "being obedient, became the cause of salvation for herself and for the whole human race." Hence not a few of the early Fathers gladly assert in their preaching, "The knot of Eve's disobedience was untied by Mary's obedience; what the virgin Eve bound through her unbelief, the Virgin Mary loosened by her faith." Comparing Mary with Eve, they call her "the Mother of the living," and still more often they say: "death through Eve, life through Mary."
