## **A RIGHT TO LIFE?**

Animals, or certain animals it seems, can think – or so *Time Magazine* reported in a feature article some years ago entitled “Inside the Minds of Animals.” That was not a revelation to me. For fifteen years I have watched my dog make what seem to be “conscious” decisions about, among other things, whether she wanted me to throw the Frisbee or the tennis ball (these days in her dotage, she will only occasionally consent to catch the ball). She would point at each toy as if she’d were playing “eenie, meenie, ...” and then would choose whatever – I imagine – gave her the most joy at the moment.

We have become ever more conscious of how important that part of creation which groans in expectation for “the sons of God to be revealed” (Romans 8:20-21) is to us. Some may remember the rich woman from the book/miniseries *All Creatures Great and Small* who doted over her beloved Tricky Woo. I knew a sheep farmer who loved his shepherd dogs but would not hesitate to put one down if it acquired the taste of sheep’s blood. Every Christmas, his donkey Toby would be treated to fresh hay and apples in honor of the role the donkey played in carrying Our Lady to Bethlehem.

According to *Time Magazine*, however, the great cross-species leveler is the experience of suffering. According to *Time*, this indisputable fact, heralded by Princeton University bio-ethicist Peter Singer in his 1975 book *Animal Liberation*, was what launched the animal rights movement and promoted a more humane treatment of animals.

In light of our society’s concern and interest in animals and the rest of creation, our nation’s wholesale indifference to abortion and the refusal to afford the human right to life to the unborn is more than perplexing. *Time* laid bare the incongruity when not long after the article on animals it published an issue featuring the new science of fetal origins. The magazine’s front cover displayed a picture of a pregnant mother with the words: “How the first nine months shape the rest of your life.” New and extensive research shows that our health and well-being are powerfully shaped during gestation. What our mothers eat and drink, their behavior and the environment they live in, how they relate to their unborn child in the womb, and so many other factors all are apparently determinative of who and how we are after we are born. The author writes that what is held to be commonplace, that our childhood experiences make a profound difference in who we are as adults, will be said as well of the nine months we spend in the womb.

I doubt most people who believe abortion is a fundamental right in our country would deny that the

fetus in the womb is alive. Medical experience proves that the “fetus” has a heart beat and brain waves, and no less than an animal or maybe more, possesses the capacity to experience pain and suffering. Crazy, the pro-choice philosophy suggests the fetus is not a child because it has not reached a stage of development that entitles it to birth. Given the research reported by *Time*, that there is no state of development that is unimportant in the unborn child’s life, the pro-abortion stance is absurd. If that is not the question, then it comes down to deciding who deserves life more, the mother or the child, a decision no society should make.

Maybe it’s just as important to highlight the ultimate fruit of abortion rather than its absurdity. The thought that men and women who could have lent their gifts toward the common good of humanity will never be because they were denied the right to life in the womb is the great tragedy of the last half of the twentieth and this century.

Respect Life month this October asks us to consider how the Church’s constant proclamation of the Gospel and her works confirm the sanctity of life.

Her message is the same at any time in history or anywhere: nothing proclaims the value and goodness of human life more than the Resurrection of Jesus.
