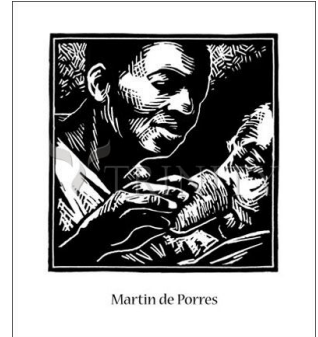

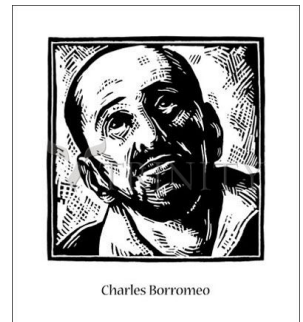

PURGATORY

"I would go so far as to say that if there was no purgatory, then we would have to invent it, for who would dare say of himself that he was able to stand directly before God. And yet we don't want to be, to use an image from Scripture, 'a pot that turned out wrong', that has to be thrown away; we want to be able to be just right. Purgatory basically means that God can put the pieces back together again. That He can cleanse us in such a way that we are able to be with Him and can stand there in the fullness of life. Purgatory strips off one person what is unbearable and from another the inability to bear certain things, so that in each of them a pure heart is revealed, and we can see that we all belong together in one enormous symphony of being."

THE SOLEMNITY OF ALL SAINTS – THE MEMORIAL OF ALL SOULS

Angelo Tosto. He was one of the homebound men and women I would visit each month in St. Barnabas Parish. He was, I think, in his mid-to-late nineties. Whenever I went to his apartment, he would greet me in his native Italian dialect and then continue on, not remembering how little Italian I knew.

He wanted to talk, mostly about the things he thought I would find interesting. It was always the same: some mention of his trade as a shoemaker, but then a long remembrance of how he had once skipped Mass when he was a little boy in Italy in order to play football with the other boys. His mother knew, of course, and he never forgot the lesson he learned after that. I don't know whether she punished or scolded him or whether she merely told him how important it was to her for him to go to Mass. All I knew is that he never forgot, and never skipped Mass again, until age and health made it no longer possible. Something I gathered his love for her, and the love he knew she had for him, seemed to compel him from then on always to do what his mother wanted him to do. Communion was important; he looked forward to my visit.

Angelo was an extraordinary man. He had no formal education beyond a few years of high school, but he read voraciously. He loved the United States and had letters from every president who thanked him for his small service on a local level. Ever gracious, he would offer me a cordial (politely declined) after he received the Lord in Holy Communion.

I cannot judge if Angelo was a saint or not. I know he was an awfully good man who tried to do the Lord's will in his life and loved Jesus. He impressed me and I think my faith is a little bit stronger because of him. I won't forget him.

As we prepare to celebrate God's gift to us of the saints and our communion with them, and all the faithful departed, and in particular those who made an especial impact on our lives, we ought to think - as Angelo thought of his mother - about how they have helped us remain faithful to the Lord, by their prayers and exhortations, by their living witness in life and death. God wants us to discover as much as we can about Him through our interaction with others who have their own experience and understanding of who He is. Whether those men and women are still among us, as living saints or souls striving to be holy, or have gone before us as saints, or souls being purified by God's love (purgatory) in preparation for His kingdom, their role in our lives is sure proof of why we celebrate the Communion of the Saints every November 1 and the love that unites us through death to all the holy souls on November 2.
