

## **OUR LADY OF ADVENT BY**

*by Father Doughty*

Dante: "I saw a Beauty smile on the angelic games and songs, a Beauty that was joy to the eyes of all the other Saints.... Now look upon that face which is most similar to that of Christ; its clarity alone can dispose you to the Christ. I saw such happiness rain upon her, joy carried in the holy minds created to traverse such heights, that whatever I had seen previously did not fill with such admiration nor show me so great a likeness to God."

St. Anselm: "Blessed Lady, sky and stars, earth and rivers, day and night - everything that is subject to the power or use of man - rejoice that through you they are in some sense restored to their lost beauty and are endowed with inexpressible new grace.... Lady, full and overflowing with grace, all creation receives new life from your abundance. Virgin, blessed above all creatures, through your blessing all creation is blessed, not only creation from its Creator, but the Creator himself has been blessed by creation.... Truly the Lord is with you, to whom the Lord granted that all nature should owe as much to you as to himself."

St. Bernadette of Lourdes: "Mademoiselle," I said, "would you be so kind as to tell me who you are, if you please?" The Lady extended her hands towards the ground, swept them upwards to join them on her heart, raised her eyes, but not her head to Heaven, leaned tenderly towards me and said, "Que soy era Immaculada Conception."

Lumen Gentium: "This maternity of Mary in the economy of grace lasts uninterruptedly from the consent that she faithfully offered at the Annunciation and sustained without hesitation beneath the Cross until the perpetual consummation of all the Elect. Assumed into heaven, she does not lay aside this salvific office, but by her multifold intercession continues to obtain for us the gifts of eternal salvation. With her motherly love she takes care of the brothers and sisters of Christ who are still on pilgrimage in the midst of dangers and sorrows."

Bishop Austin Vaughan: "Is there a presence of Mary as mystery in all salvific acts? I know many people might find that a little bit repelling, too strong. Yet, we have lived with centuries of writers, many of them

saints, who maintained that all grace comes through Mary. Does that mean anything beyond intercession, in terms of her direct and immediate contact with us?"


St. John Paul II: "No one has received into his heart, as much as Mary did, that mystery, that truly divine dimension of the redemption effected on Calvary by means of the death of the Son, together with the sacrifice of her maternal heart, together with her definitive fiat.... Mary, then, is the one who has the deepest knowledge of the mystery of God's mercy. She knows its price; she knows how great it is. In this sense, we call her the Mother of Mercy: Our Lady of Mercy, or Mother of Divine Mercy..."

St. Augustine: "She gave milk to our bread."


