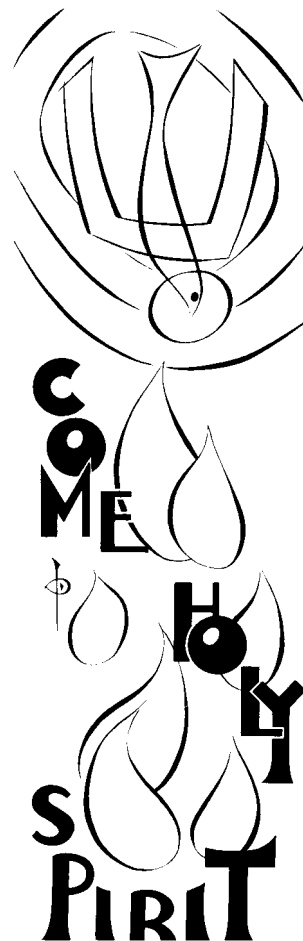

CELEBRATING PENTECOST LIKE WE MEAN IT

While Apollos was in Corinth, Paul traveled through the interior of the country and down to Ephesus where he found some disciples. He said to them, "Did you receive the Holy Spirit when you became believers?" They answered him, "We have never even heard that there is a Holy Spirit" (Acts 19:1-2).

The disciples Saint Paul had met in Ephesus on his third missionary journey almost certainly learned about Jesus and the Resurrection. They had been baptized, by their account, with the baptism of John, which Paul had explained was a baptism of repentance, of preparation for the arrival of the Christ. As such, this baptism was not a sacrament; it did not confer the graces a person receives when they receive the baptism that Jesus told the disciples to share with all the world. When Paul baptized these men and women according to the ritual with which we are all familiar ("I baptize you in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit") we're told in Acts that they immediately began to speak in tongues and prophesy. The fruits of the sacrament given to them are indisputable: *with the result that all the inhabitants of the province of Asia heard the word of the Lord, Jews and Greeks alike (Acts 19:10)*

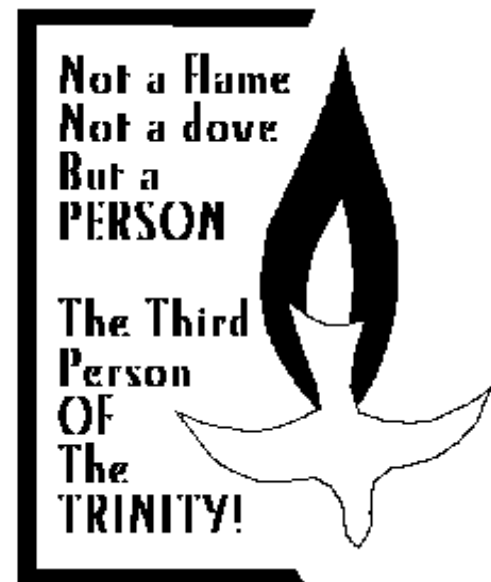
"We have never even heard that there is a Holy Spirit." Could we say these words are echoed by the disciples of Christ today as well.

Sadly, I find too many Catholics sell short the gifts of the Spirit that are given to them through the sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation and on each and every occasion that Holy Communion is received. In fact, in all the sacraments - Matrimony, Holy Orders, Anointing of the Sick, and Reconciliation - the Spirit is shared in some manner that is no less dramatic than when Saint Paul baptized the Ephesians or even when the disciples gathered in the upper room and received the Holy Spirit on Pentecost.

While our solemn feast of Pentecost today commemorates (as both historical event and for celebration) that day when the Holy Trinity was fully revealed, it also reminds us of the possibilities

bestowed on us to see the happy news of Jesus' Resurrection embraced as the sign of God's love for us through all the world. *No one comprehends the thoughts of God except the Spirit of God (1 Cor 2:11).* It is through this Spirit *working in us that can accomplish more than we can ask or imagine!* (Ephesians 3:20-21).

I read of a pastor from the mid-west who thought it a good idea not only to take time to recall today the outpouring of the Holy Spirit we received on our own Confirmation day, but also recommended the faithful wear something red, the liturgical color for Pentecost which reminds us of the fire of God's love, which was first received by the Apostles are seen as "tongues of fire" above them. If it's too late to encourage it for this year's celebration of the feast, it would certainly be a dramatic sight for next years, wouldn't it? And "dramatic" is what we should expect!
