FATIMA ANNIVERSARY

Thursday, July 13th will mark the 100th anniversary of Our Lady's third appearance in Fatima, Portugal. Parishioners will commemorate this event by meeting to pray the rosary in front of the Saint Thomas school building by the statue of the Blessed Mother at 7:00PM that day. In the event of rain, we will meet in the gym. All are invited!

For the 100th anniversary of the apparitions of Our Lady of Fatima in Portugal, Pope Francis has decided to grant a plenary indulgence opportunity throughout the entire anniversary year, which began Nov. 27, 2016, and will end Nov. 26, 2017.

Three ways to obtain the plenary indulgence (the faithful must also fulfill the ordinary conditions: go to Confession and Communion, be interiorly detached from sin, and pray for the intentions of the Holy Father.)

1. Make a pilgrimage to the Fatima shrine in Portugal In addition, the faithful must pray the Our Father, recite the Creed, and invoke the Mother of God.

2. Pray before any statue of Our Lady of Fatima During the days of the anniversary of the apparitions, the 13th of each month from May to October (2017), and there devoutly participate in some celebration or prayer in honor of the Virgin Mary. Those seeking an indulgence must also pray an Our Father, recite the Creed and invoke Our Lady of Fatima.

3. The elderly and infirm These individuals can pray in front of a statue of Our Lady of Fatima and must spiritually unite themselves to the jubilee celebrations on the days of the apparitions, the 13th of each month, between May and October 2017. They also must "offer to merciful God with confidence, through Mary, their prayers and sufferings or the sacrifices they make in their own lives."

Secrets to be unmasked... treasures to be found...
mysteries to be solved!

All marvelously wonderful things in life. To know something that others perhaps do not, to find a treasure that has been missing or buried or just unknown or to figure out and solve a mystery of life. We all have experiences of those kinds of things in our life's journey. But typically we think of them in somewhat limited ways. The secret of a great recipe or the finding of a treasure trove of old photos of loved ones or perhaps solving the mystery of an unexplained gift you received. All hidden things, if you will. Today's gospel from St. Matthew speaks of hidden things being revealed to the "little ones". We are those "little ones" and what is being revealed to us is the love that God the Father has for each of us. That is what Jesus, the Son of God, was sent to do... reveal the love of the Father... to make known to us who the Father is and how immense his love is for us.

Jesus, the God man, truly human, truly divine takes on our flesh, our humanity, to incarnate the love of the Father. He becomes one of us in all things but sin and spends His life in obedience to the Father to pay the debt that humanity incurred by allowing sin to enter the world. He dies so we can live forever... he takes on our humanity so we can share in His divinity.

It is the 'Mystery of our Faith'... Christ has died...
Christ has risen... Christ will come again!

It is the prayer we pray at every Mass we celebrate... it is, yes, the mystery of our faith but is the mystery or secret or treasure of life. And as Catholics it is **THE** great truth that we should embrace. It is **THE** secret of life unmasked... it is a treasure found whose value is incalculable mystery of the life solved. Each to understand it, preach it with



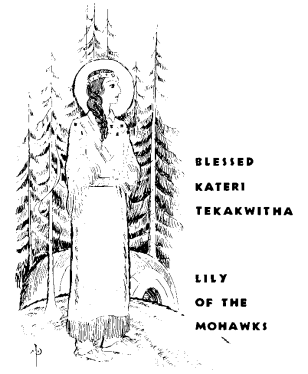
and it is the journey of us needs live it and our

SAINT KATERI TEKAKWITHA

Kateri was born around 1656 in the Mohawk village of Ossernenon, now Auriesville, NY. She lost her parents and brother in a smallpox epidemic at the age of four. From her youth, she evinced an interior innocence, refusing her relatives' attempts to arrange a marriage. She embraced the Faith at the age of twenty, and entered the Jesuit mission at Sault Saint Louis, near Montreal. There, Kateri devoted herself to good works and praying for her fellow Mohawks. At the age of twenty-three, she made a public vow of perpetual virginity. Kateri died of illness in 1680. Fifteen minutes after her death, her face, pockmarked with smallpox scars, grew clear and luminous.
