#### THE ASSUMPTION

Pope Benedict XVI wrote that "precisely because Mary is with God and in God, she is very close to each one of us. While she lived on this earth she could only be close to a few people. #### **"DO NOT BE AFRAID"**

Today's Gospel from St. Matthew includes the wonderful story of Jesus walking on water. On the face of it that would seem to be the central piece of today's lesson for us. A miracle for sure, a human, albeit the God man, walks on water. If we come away from that Gospel with only the walking on water miracle, we are selling Jesus AND ourselves oh so short.

The Gospel story begins with our being told that Jesus "had fed the people". He had told his disciples to get in a boat and proceed to a place where he would join them. When Jesus comes to them, walking on the water, we are told the boat is being "tossed about by the waves" and further we are told the disciples were "terrified". It would seem they were worried about the waves and wind that were rocking their boat and clearly shocked to see Jesus walking on the water towards them! Then we see Peter, the first Pope, also begin to walk on water towards Jesus but quickly sinks and is caught by Jesus stretching out his hand to "save" him.

This story is about God's love and concern and care for us. He "feeds" us in the Eucharist to sustain us for the journey of faith ... journey of life. He comes to us to calm the "wind and waves" that inevitably come to each of us in life. And finally he comes to "save" us by reaching out his hand or, perhaps better said, to "stretch out his arms" to save us ... to redeem us ... to prepare a place for us in Heaven. That is THE miracle of today's gospel and our faith.

This weekend the parish gathers to wish Fr. Simon well as he returns to his homeland to take up his priestly duties. He was in the US for five years and while ministering to God's people earned a Master's degree in pastoral counseling. He has

been with our parishes for the last two years and will be sorely missed. His smile ... his engaging personality ... his passionate homilies and more. But mostly we will miss his priestly ministry. His teaching us as Jesus did in today's Gospel... his "feeding" us in the Eucharistic feast ... his "stretching" out his hand in the Sacrament of Reconciliation or in the anointing of a sick parishioner or in a quiet chat with someone. We will miss his being "in persona Christi", that is, being someone who stands in the person of Christ to incarnate the love of Christ for each of us ... to "save us" from the fires of Hell. Yes, we will miss Fr. Simon and wish him God's blessings as he journeys back home.

Our heartfelt thanks to him for being our friend and our priest.
